SMAC Affiliate "The New Crusty Minstrels" performed a sing-along/sock hop concert to benefit Home Tour charities on October 25 & 26 at the SML YMCA. Almost 800 enthusiastic Lakers, many in costumes that were throwbacks to the "Where Were You, 1952-'62?" concert theme, sang and danced to 38 "American Bandstand" favorites. Several Lakers parked period cars out front of the Y, and pink and black were the predominant colors of the decor inside. Ticket sales and contributions netted in excess of \$35,000 for Home Tour charities, bringing the total raised by the first three SML New Crusty Minstrels concerts to over \$90,000! Said Russ Baskett, founder of SML Good Neighbors which has benefited from all three concerts: "The fund raising dimension of this event was fantastic, but the joy on the faces of the people who attended was phenomenal! They left uplifted, happy, feeling like teens again. It was simply wonderful."

Bedford Community Orchestra to Present Autumnal Program Concert

Saturday, Nov. 2 at 7:30 p.m. at the Bedford Middle School Auditorium in Bedford, VA. The BCO will play Gershwin's



novelty rag, "Rialto Ripples," written when the composer was just 17; Ferde Grofe's Mississippi Suite; Triumph of the Argonauts Op. 164a by Robert Sheldon, inspired by Jason's heroic journey in search of the Golden Fleece; selections from the film score from The Hobbit; and Paul Hart's "Cartoon," an artistically creative musical celebration of Saturday morning cartoons.

The BCO also will present "Inchon" by composer Robert W. Smith, inspired by the 50th anniversary of the Korean conflict. The Beautifully scored and colorfully orchestrated piece balances the delicate oriental melodies with the dramatic and frenzied passages that mirror the conflict at the heart of America's "forgotten war." The composer dedicated "Inchon" to his father, John W. Schmidt, Colonel, U.S. Marine Corps, a veteran of two wars.

Additional selections will include "Danny Boy," merged with the New World Symphony theme; and "Somerset Overture," a dazzling medley of the "Somerset Carol," "God Rest Ye Merry Gentlemen," and "Good King Wenceslas" by Robert Parker, to anticipate the holiday season.

The BCO has put together an assortment of music for every age and musical taste, and its members knocked themselves out preparing it for you. The Bedford Community Orchestra, led by Scott Walter, brings together some of the finest and most dedicated musicians in the Roanoke Valley and neighboring communities. Have a listen. 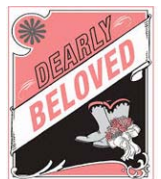

The Junior Appalachian Musicians program. (JAM's)



The Junior Appalachian Musicians program is in the process of hiring three musicians to instruct students who will be taking lessons at Burnt Chimney Elementary starting in Jan. 2014. Students will be 4th and 5th graders who go to school at Burnt Chimney Elementary, Dudley Elementary and Windy Gap Elementary. The students will take lessons for one hour after school and parents must transport students who come from another school. The instruments will be banjo, guitar and fiddle.

The students will play by ear and after they learn some songs all students will get together to play the same songs as a group. There have been many donations of guitars and some fiddles already. Students will be charged \$10 an hour for each lesson and students who are on free or reduced lunch will pay \$5 an hour. SMAC has agreed to help with funding of student lessons for families that cannot afford this cost.

A grant from the Virginia Commission of the Arts is being written to help fund this program and SMAC has held two benefit concerts already to get the program off the ground.
