## SMAC Scholarships: Smith Mountain Arts Council Awards Scholarships

The Smith Mountain Arts Council has awarded two-year college scholarships to Julia Robertson and Sage Wright, each in the amount of \$2000. Julia is a senior at Staunton River High School; Sage a senior at Franklin County High School. The scholarships will be paid \$1000 per year for the first two years of college.

Sage Wright is a violinist planning to be a professional musician and businessman, and will major in business management and music performance. Miss Robertson is an artist planning to pursue a double major in fine art or graphic design and French. And in addition to their impressive artistic talents Sage and Julia have distinguished high school records, accomplishments, and commendations.

Students applying for SMAC scholarships must demonstrate talent in the Performing, Visual or Literary Arts as well as exhibit academic qualifications. SMAC applications are open to seniors at Franklin County High School, Gretna High School, Staunton River High School, and students home-schooled in these geographic areas.

The scholarships, along with SMAC's other youth programs, are an important part of its mission to comprehensively promote the arts at the Lake. The Scholarship Committee received nine applications this year and was particularly impressed by the skill and hard work these students efforts promise for the future.

## The Junior Appalachian Musicians program. (JAM's)

JAM has finished its first semester of lessons. We had 13 lessons and the students performed a short concert on May 16th and Tenbrooks, a bluegrass band, played for the visitors and students.

We are trying to start a new JAM program at Benjamin Franklin Middle School in Rocky Mount for the rising 6th graders so they will be able to continue their JAM instruction next school year. There will be 30 students playing guitar, banjo and fiddle. We will continue the program at Burnt Chimney Elementary and enroll another 30 students at that location.



We want to thank Smith Mountain Arts Council for their support and encouragement for this program. Next year will be our first full year long program and we are expecting excellent results from all our JAM students

## John Faber Memorial Photography Show Receives High Acclaim

SMAC's annual photography contest and show kicked off May 23 with 200 people attending the evening reception and awards ceremony. Reception goers enjoyed high-quality photography, the musical sounds of newly-formed trio "Good Impressions," and tasty refreshments. The co-chairs, Barb Nocera and Kathy Orth, were pleased to announce that this year's show was the second largest with 352 entries submitted by 82 photographers.

The show's namesake, Mr. John Faber, was a renowned photojournalist who, with his wife Trudy, retired at SML. Mr. Faber passed away in 1993. From 1950 to 1983 Faber served as Eastman-Kodak's technical and public relations representative to the major news organizations, working closely with a number of well-known photographers, including Margaret Bourke-White.

In 1963, Mr. Faber became the first Westerner to interview the Dalai-Lama. His photo was used as the Dalai Lama's official portrait for many years.

He documented the history of news photography, interviewing the great photojournalists of the 20th century. His research resulted in the book "Great News Photos and the Stories Behind Them," which was nominated for a Pulitzer Prize in 1979.

Present at the show were Mrs. Trudy Faber, the Fabers' son, Erich, and grandson, Luke, age 10.

The entries were judged by Bob Brown, senior photographer at the Richmond Times-Dispatch and Siobhan Byrns, assistant professor of photography and graphic design at Lynchburg College.
