## SMAC Scholarships

Smith Mountain Arts Council announces the availability of two \$2,000 college scholarships for high school seniors demonstrating talent in the Performing, Visual or Literary Arts. Eligible students must be attending the following high schools or are home schooled in the geographic areas of these schools: Franklin County High School, Gretna High School, Staunton River High School, Christian Heritage Academy and SML Christian Academy.

Applications are also open to students who will be studying in all recognized academic disciplines at either two - or four-year accredited colleges, universities, or community colleges. This is a change from a previous rule which stated that the scholarships were only available to students who planned to pursue an arts major. It is hoped that this will bring in a wider selection of talented students.

### Summer Arts Camp: ages 8-12

- **Playful Exploration of 3D Materials:** July 16-20. 8:30am-12:30pm; Students will work with three dimensional materials and are given engineering problems to solve both individually and as teams. Construction techniques are then applied to art projects involving wooden sculptures, leather, and weaving projects.
- **Fun with Clay:** July 23-27, 10am-12pm. Explore the wonder that is clay... moist, squishy, stretchy, pinchy, roly, pokey, pulley, delightful. Learn the basics of hand building with clay and will be an introduction to wheel- throwing to form bowls.
- **iPad Animation:** July 23-27 1-3pm. iPads are amazing tools for producing media, creative expression, and developing critical thinking. They are complete production studios. We start the week with an introduction to apps to learn the basics of animation, video production, and book design. Students will spend the rest of the week creating their own projects. This is a supportive, collaborative environment for learning new skills.

## **The Junior Appalachian Musicians program. (JAM's)**

The Wayne Henderson Festival was an excellent event of Old Time Appalachian music featuring Ricky Scaggs and his wife Sharon White. The Gibson Brothers from New York also performed. The festival was in Grayson Highlands State Park on June 16th.



At the event scholarship award winners were given their scholarship checks and the Franklin County JAM program received a \$2,500 check to support our local Junior Appalachian Musician (JAM) program for the following year. We have hired two new musicians from Floyd to teach at the Gereau Center starting in early September 2018.



The support from SMAC is crucial to our program to teach young students old time Appalachian music. We value the support and look forward to a new semester with students. We anticipate enrolling around 20 students in the program beginning in August.
