Students performed in October for the Brickhouse Church of the Brethren to benefit a food drive for children at Boones Mill Elementary School.



Lake Players Serve Merry Mayhem in the Comedy "Drinking Habits"

Bravo to The Lake Players of SMAC for their recent production of "Drinking Habits," a farce written by Tom Smith, performed at Bethlehem United Methodist Church.

The story was set in the 1960s at the Convent of the Sisters of Perpetual Sewing, where some of the nuns were secretly making and selling wine in order to keep to the convent open. The fun started when reporters Paul and Sally, played by Mike Dittrich and Mimi McHale, arrived in search of a story for their newspaper. Forced to disguise themselves as clergy, they kept the audience laughing with improbable



identity and costume changes. Penny Larsen as Mother Superior, Anne Motley as Sister Augusta, and Pam Gabriel as Sister Philamena added to the hilarity with their efforts to keep Rome from closing down the convent. Becki Fuzi was endearing as the sweet, naïve novice, Sister Mary Catherine. Her admirer George, the amiable groundskeeper at the convent, was played by Jim Tarantino. John Maresca portrayed Father Chenille, parish priest and amateur magician, with amusing sleight of hand.

Mistaken identities, family secrets, long-lost loves, suspicions of spies from the Vatican, all made for outrageous plot twists before the story was brought to a surprising and satisfying conclusion. From their laughter and applause, it was obvious the audience thoroughly enjoyed the show.

Nancy King did a fine job of directing the comedy. The costuming by Connie Canova was very well done, especially with all the quick changes required by some members of the cast. Stage managers Joyce Dittrich and Charlene Maresca, as well as backstage crew members Shirley Sorrentino, Michele Tarantino, Elda Nichols and Al Fuzi, also deserve credit for their contributions to the production.
