


Presidents Message...

Lake Quilters Guild at Smith Mountain Lake

he Lake Quilters Guild (LQG) at SML is a nonprofit organization and has been serving the SML area for over 30 years. LQG welcomes everyone interested in the art and craft of quilting, and encourages interested individuals to attend monthly meetings where they will learn about LQG, see a presentation from a professional quilter, a local quilt shop owner, or one of the members, and see a "Show & Tell" presented by the members displaying their latest quilt or quilt-related items.

As a special service to the community, LQG members make quilt items for donation to various charitable organizations around the SML community. These items include quilts and quilt-related items such as baby quilts, comfort quilts, wheelchair lap quilts, fidget quilts for memory patients, dog beds, pillow cases, and teddy bears. We contribute to local hospitals, local nursing homes, local domestic shelters, local assisted living, and local animal shelters.

LQG also provides educational programs that are typically run through our Community Out-Reach Exploration Events (CORE) program. CORE enables LQG to host various training programs that offer the SML community an opportunity to learn more about quilting practices. LQG has three major events coming up within the next year. The next CORE Program is on July 20, 2023, at 5:00 pm at the SML/Moneta Library. During the months of September and October, LQG will host a mini quilt show at the SML/Moneta Library. LQG's major quilt show will happen in June of 2024 and will be at the Eastlake Community Church. This is LQG's largest quilt show that is presented every other year and features more than 150 quilts made by members of the guild.


