n December 15, 2023, our Annual Christmas Concert " Home for the Holidays" was a delightful event that sparked everyone to bring in the holiday spirits. Bravo, what an excellent performance.

Our Maestro, **David Stewart Wiley**, has conducted such symphonies as Atlanta, Buffalo, Cincinnati, San Francisco, Milwaukee, Indianapolis, Minnesota, Saint Louis, Oregon, Hawaii, and Utah, as well as in dozens of countries in Asia, Africa, and Europe. The Roanoke Symphony board recently extended David Stewart Wiley's contract for another 4 years, which will make him the longest-tenured Music Director & Conductor in its storied 71-year history.

he Rainier Trio has established itself as an engaging and energetic group that captivates audiences with the magic of violinist and violist brothers Kevin and Bryan Matheson and their fabulous pianist Brenda Wittwer. They have won the hearts of audiences in concerts throughout Virginia, Pennsylvania, Maryland, West Virginia, and North Carolina.

The trio has performed at Musikfest in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania,

collaborated with opera singers at the Vocal Arts and Music Festival at Virginia Tech and their album was chosen as "CD of the week" by WQED Pittsburgh.

ailed as "two perfect virtuosos" at their international performance début, Kevin and Bryan Matheson of the Classic Strings Duo were received with critical acclaim at their Carnegie Weill Recital Hall début as part of the Ibla Grand Prize competition winners' tour. Recognized for their mesmerizing and spirited performances - two perfect virtuosos, playing as one, they have performed twice at Yamaha Hall in Japan as well as in Sicily, Ireland, and the Czech Republic.

Pianist Brenda Wittwer is a native of Charlotte, NC. She began her piano studies at the age of 4 with jazz pianistarranger Ziggy Hurwitz and continued her studies at age 11 with concert pianist, Anita Bultmann Tritt. Brenda earned her Bachelor of Music degree from Queens University. Through the years she has been accompanist for a number of musicals, performed as one of two pianists in a piano duo featuring music of the Masters, accompanist for Theater Charlotte, Pfeiffer University Concert Choir and Sounds of America, a musical group which toured the 48 continuous states. With the Wytheville Community College Choir, she has performed at Lincoln Center and Carnegie Hall in New York City.



The SML Photo Club provides creative support of all area photographers. The club meets in the Moneta Library's Community room on the first Monday of each month at 7pm.








