



e are so excited to be part of SML Gives Day this year! Every dollar you donate to Smith Mountain Arts Council through the SML Gives platform on March 13th will go towards programs that help educate youth in our community.

The Smith Mountain Arts Council, while constantly ensuring the arts in all forms are being brought to the local community, is particularly proud to be striving to find new ways to be serving our youth. We have a successful Scholarship Program that awards two deserving graduating high school students a two-year scholarship, allowing them to pursue education in the arts. We also support the Junior Appalachian Musicians program, which we

have done for almost 30 years, where students grade 4-8 are taught to play traditional old time and bluegrass music. JAM introduces music through small group instruction on instruments common to the Appalachian region, such as fiddle, banjo and guitar. We began a very successful Youth Arts Camp in 2023 for children ages 9-14. Participants signed up for three classes in either painting, acting, singing, photography or writing. We are especially proud of the focus we are putting on educating this next generation of up-and-coming artists to carry on the arts in all forms in our community and beyond. 
